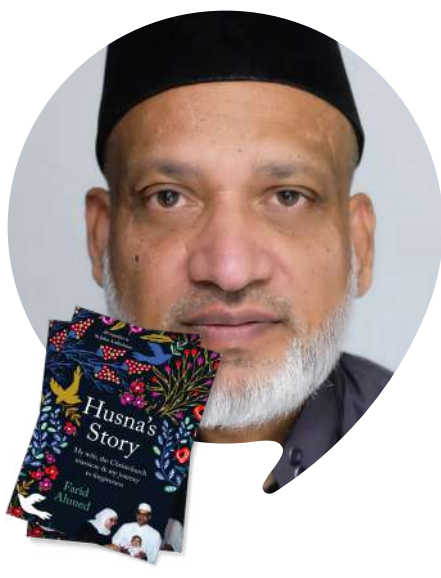




FARID AHMED: HUSNA'S STORY

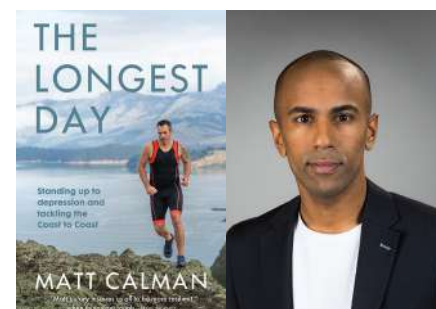

Husna Ahmed was a victim of the shooting, killed while looking for her husband, who was in a wheelchair. In *Husna's Story*, Farid Ahmed tells his wife's story, including the tragic account of the shootings. He also outlines his philosophy of forgiveness, which he has travelled the world to convey. His conversation with Raf Manji should not be missed by anyone who was affected by that terrible day in our city.

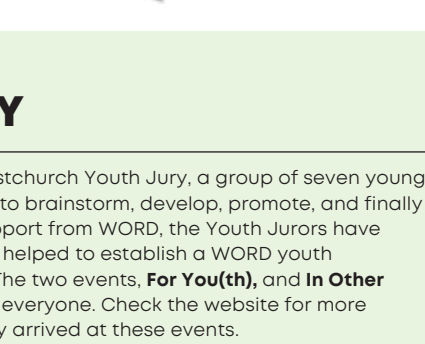

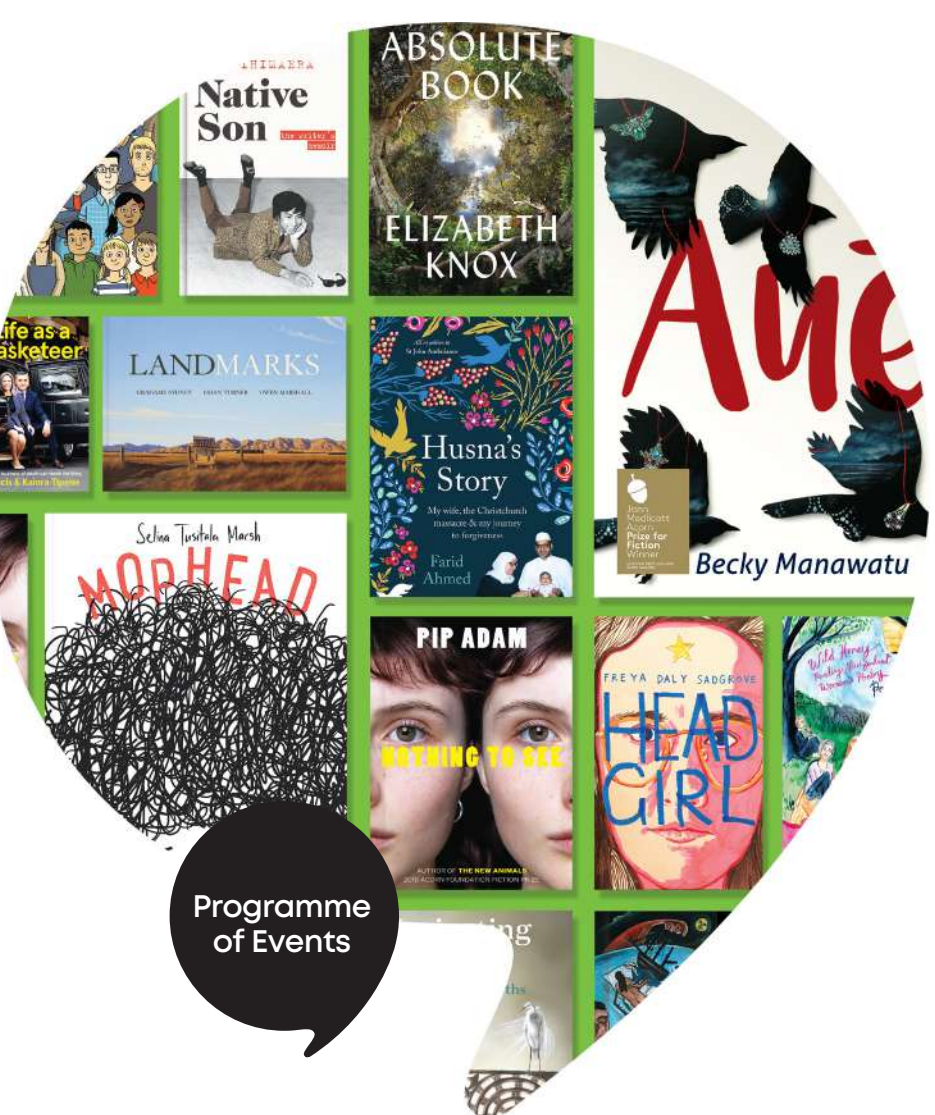
